Youth Shooting Program Tiers

Intro to Rifle - Students with 0-2 years of firearms experience.

Intro to Shotgun or Sporting Clays - Students with 0-2 years shooting experience

Intro to Trap Shooting - Students with 0-2 Years of Trap Experience

For the above programs instruction will take place Sundays beginning May 5 through June 9 from 9:00 am - 11:00 am or 12:30 pm - 2:30 pm

The cost for the 6 week shotgun program is \$350.

Intro to Archery - Students with 0-2 Years of Archery Experience

Instruction will take place 5:30 pm - 7:30 pm Mondays, May 6 through June 10 or Wednesdays, May 8, through June 12

The cost for the 6 week archery program is \$250.

Dress Code & Parent Notes

The dress code is strictly enforced and children not in accordance will be asked to change or not practice for the day. The dress code applies to any parents who are spectating their child's practice on the Hudson Farm Grounds

- No blue jeans are allow on the Hudson Farm Grounds
- T-shirts or sleeveless shirts are prohibited - Collared shirts are recommended
- Closed toe shoes are required
- During summer months shorts of an appropriate length are acceptable. (Must be fingertip length with hands at sides)
- Parents are invited and encouraged to stay and watch their children practice but must keep at least 15 feet away
- Students should arrive at least 15 minutes prior to lesson start time to sign and prepare
- Only break-open firearms are allowed on the Hudson Farm Grounds - No side load, no pump action
- Crossbows are not allowed on the archery course
