



2026 Youth Archery Programs at Griffin & Howe

The Griffin & Howe Shooting Academy is continuing its proud partnership with the Tri-State Youth Safety and Shooting Education Foundation, to offer a range of youth clinics to local students age 10 - 18 at their indoor archery range at Hudson Farm. This program gives students the opportunity to learn the basics and fundamentals of shooting safety at one of the finest facilities in the country, and aims to improve skills and educational performance among students in grades 5 – 12.

Through the discipline of archery, students are learning focus, self-control, patience, and the life lessons required to be successful in the classroom and in life. These programs are funded in part by donations made to the Tri-State Youth Safety and Shooting Education Foundation, making them a great value for participants.

INTRODUCTION TO ARCHERY HALF DAY PROGRAMS

Introducing the fundamentals of archery with a focus on safety. Students will start with stance, bow hand-set, string hand-set and pre-draw, before learning how to draw, anchor, aim and follow through, shooting at targets up to 15 yards.

All equipment is provided.

INTRODUCTION TO COMPOUND BOW HALF DAY PROGRAMS

Must have completed Introduction to Archery. Students will be introduced to compound bows and learn about the equipment setup and tuning process, then work more on proper shooting posture, aiming accuracy, and shooting longer distances at 20 yards.

Classes will run on the following dates from 9am - 12pm:

Sunday June 28th
Sunday August 9th
Saturday October 24th
Sunday December 6th

DRESS CODE AND PARENT NOTES

No blue jeans, t-shirts or sleeveless shirts – collared shirts and closed toed shoes are required. During summer months, shorts of an appropriate length are acceptable (must be at least fingertip length with hands at sides).
